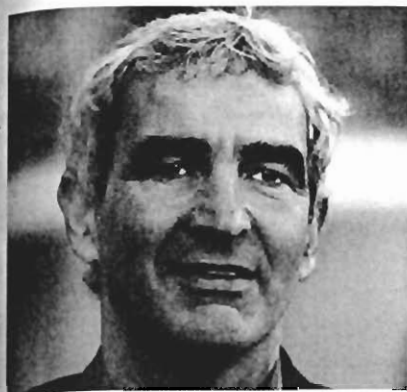
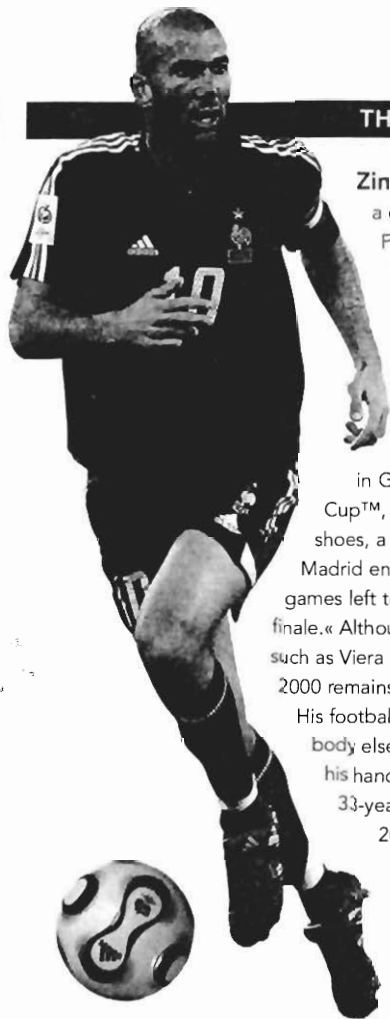


## THE COACH



**Raymond Domenech** Domenech was appointed head coach of the «Équipe Tricolore» after the EURO 2004. An uncompromising left defence player, the native of Lyon played in 433 league and eight international games. In 1978 and 1982 he narrowly missed the appointment to the World Cup roster of «Les Bleus.» In 1993, Domenech took over France's U-21 national team, which subsequently featured such players as Zidane, Vieira, Henry, Trezeguet, Anelka, Gallas and Cisse. Domenech, who is said to have a brusque and abrasive manner, is considered a strong proponent of discipline.

**Zinedine Zidane** On 17 August 2005, a wave of collective relief swept across France. After a 14-month abstinence, Zinedine Zidane resumed his career in the national jersey. With the luminary's return to the midfield of the «Équipe Tricolore,» normalcy also returned to France, meaning that the national team easily passed the qualification for the final round in Germany. After the 2006 FIFA World Cup™, Zidane will finally take off his football shoes, a year before his contract with Real Madrid ends. The elegant playmaker has seven games left to top his career with a »grande finale.« Although France also has other top players such as Viera or Henry, the European champion of 2000 remains the key figure in the French team. His football genius decides games. Hardly anybody else combines lightness and efficiency in his handling of the ball as impressively as the 33-year-old FIFA World Footballer of 1998, 2000 and 2003. At the latest by 9 July, »the best No. 10 since Michel Platini« will enter the football stage for the last time. A new chapter of life will then start for the father of four sons.
